Call for nominations 2025/2026

What is the National Youth Assembly of Ireland?

The National Youth Assembly acts as a consultative youth forum on topics of national interest. The Youth Assembly plays a significant role in including the voice of young people in implementing public policy and prioritising actions for Government. Young people aged 12-24 years meet on different policy topics that are of importance to and impact on young people such as Climate and Rural Development.

What's involved?

- 60 successful candidates will become part of the National Youth Assembly of Ireland as sitting delegates. As delegates, young people can have their voice heard and make recommendations directly to Government to inform public policy.
- Delegates have the opportunity to meet expert panels in important areas such as Climate and Rural Development. There is also opportunities to join Youth Advisory Groups, meet policy makers and sit on other forums and groups.
- Delegates are supported by staff to engage as fully as possible in all aspects of the Assembly.
- PLEASE NOTE: **You can only be nominated by one organisation.** Multiple nomination's from different organisations for the same person will result in all those nominations being invalid.

What do you need to do next?
